If you have uniforms or sports clothes that your children have outgrown, please send them to school in a bag.

Free School Meal Entitlement - Please see the information below regarding free school meal entitlement.

If you are eligible, please apply, there is no stigma, we have processes in place to ensure confidentiality for your family.

You must be aware that the number of pupils registered for Free School Meals is used by the Scottish Government for making a range of extremely important strategic decisions about our school.

This includes – Pupil Equity Funding (PEF) allocation- in Abbeyhill this supports additional staffing for SfL and Nurture staff, Gold and Grey, additional curriculum resources and additional PSA time.

We have an issue with many families who are entitled to this funding not applying, and this means our school can miss out on vital opportunities.

There have been recent changes, which are outlined below. If you need help to complete the application process. Please call the office and Ms Wynn or Mrs Singh will be happy to support you.

Recent changes:

From 1 April, children and young people will be eligible to receive free school meals through targeted provision if their parents or carers are in receipt of any of the following:

- Income support;
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance;
- Income-based Employment and Support Allowance;
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999;
- Universal Credit (where their monthly earned income is not more than £796);
- Child Tax Credit, but not Working Tax Credit, where their income is less than £19,995
- Both Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit where their income is not more than £9,552.

The Regulations which seek to amend the eligibility criteria for recipients of both Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit, or Universal Credit, can be viewed through the following web link: The Education (Scotland) Act 1980 (Modification) Regulations 2024 (legislation.gov.uk)
